AFTER ACTION REPORT ASLOK 87

The sound of gunfire signalled the start of festivities and it wasn't long before the tournament LOCATION became OVERSTACKED by a HUMAN WAVE SMC OVERRUN. ASLOK 87 was a three day near non-stop exclusively ASL event with 44 dice rolling FANATIC BERSERKERS gathered together in a single LOCATION to lay down over 144 (really gross!) games in their quest for CX (complete exhaustion). To promote play and to accomodate those arriving at different times throughout the three days as well as those leaving early, ASLOK 87 featured an experimental, loosely structured tournament using mostly published scenarios, emphasising quick play, chosen by the players themselves. The tournament also featured individual, convenient starting times for each round. After finishing a scenario, participants could either take an INTENTIONAL BREAK (not causing DM status) or immediately take on the next available opponent. This favored faster players and greatly reduced between round "dead" time.

Up to ten scenarios counted toward "NET WINS" (wins minus losses, with PCT. as tiebreaker) in determining tournament standings. As the dust was settling, Mark Nixon (9-1) narrowly edged out Darryl Burk (8-1) with Ray Woloszyn (6-1) close behind. George Sedivy also received an honorable mention by virtue of being the only ASLOKER to defeat Mark Nixon. Larry Winslow's 30+ BOXCARS allowed him to walk away with the Pvt. ROTTENROLLER award, while David Thalheimer's 8 shots claimed highest RATE OF FIRE, stopping only because he had eliminated all targets and had nothing left to shoot.

Also on hand was very special guest Charlie Kibler, AH's artist extraordinaire, whose invaluable assistance helped keep the tournament running smooth. He also held a PARTISAN! scenario art matching contest won by Eric Baker, and collected some names for PARTISAN! SMC. But it was Charlie's show-n-tell of his future project, tentatively titled RED BARRICADES, that had all of the East Front nuts drooling, especially all over the "actual terrain" mapsheet.

All in all, everyone seemed to have a great time ACQUIRING battle fatigue (the average ASLOKER played 7 scenarios and attended two days). Well over twice the size of ASLOK 86, it appears as though the ASL OKTOBERFEST is here to stay!

As you can see, Joe Suchar's and Jon Mishcon's 1987 ORIGIN'S COMBAT LEADER scenarios were extremely popular. Only three scenarios appeared lopsided: Shklov's Labors Lost and Fighting Withdrawal were PRO RUSSIAN, while Guryev's Headquarters was PRO GERMAN. The BALANCE provisions might bring these back to equal.
